Dear Mr. Manering:

On July 5, 2012, Ohio EPA conducted a complaint investigation of your automotive repair business in Jackson, Ohio, in response to a complaint received by this office alleging improper management of automotive fluids. You were present during the investigation.

Based on my investigation, I found the following violations of Ohio's hazardous waste laws. In order to correct these violations, you must do the following and send me the required information **within 21 days** of the date of this letter:

- (1) OAC Rule 3745-279-22 (C) and (D), Used Oil Storage Requirements for Generators:** (C) Containers and tanks of used oil must be labeled with the words "Used Oil"; (D) Upon detection of a release of used oil to the environment, a used oil generator must stop the release, contain the released used oil, clean up and properly manage the released used oil, and materials used to clean up the used oil, and if necessary, repair or replace any leaking used oil storage containers prior to returning them to service for used oil storage.

Numerous unlabeled used oil containers, including 5-gallon buckets, 55-gallon drums, a 350-gallon tote, and a plastic tub were stockpiled both inside and outside the facility. Used oil had spilled from an open pan onto the floor of the garage and had not been cleaned up. In the oil storage area behind the facility, the ground was saturated with used oil beneath buckets, drums and a tote containing a total of about 500 gallons of used oil that had been stockpiled here for quite some time and never sent to a recycler. Numerous other areas scattered around the facility exterior were stained with oil. Used oil had been released onto the ground from a used oil filter, which had been placed on the ground.

(C) To correct this violation, you must begin to properly label all used oil containers with the words "Used Oil." (D) You must clean up all ground where used oil was released by excavating gravel and soil until the soil or gravel that remains is no

longer visibly contaminated with used oil and appears clean. The oil-stained materials that have been excavated should be taken to a licensed solid waste landfill. You may wish to contact the landfill prior to taking it there in order to determine if they have any additional requirements for the disposal of this waste.

To demonstrate a return to compliance with this rule, you must send me photographs of properly labeled containers of used oil. In addition, you must send me photographs of areas where soil/gravel were excavated. Please do not backfill these areas until I have reviewed the photographs and given you approval to backfill. In addition, you must send me landfill receipts to document that it has been properly disposed of. You must also take immediate steps to send all used oil offsite for recycling to a legitimate used oil recycler, and send me a receipt documenting that this has been done. ### **GENERAL COMMENTS**

- A. Ohio EPA recommends that Angles Garage take immediate steps to put procedures in place to ensure that used oil or automotive fluids are not released to the floor or to the environment. First, ensure that all containers of used oil are in good condition, labeled, and closed at all times unless adding or removing oil. Funnels should be used when adding used oil to containers in order to avoid spillage. Second, move all used oil containers into one area of the facility, and inspect it regularly to ensure that no leaking is occurring. If oil or other automotive fluids do leak onto the floor, oil dry should immediately be used to contain them, and when saturated, immediately placed in your dumpster. Any leaking containers should immediately be repaired or replaced. Any automotive fluids leaking from wrecked vehicles or vehicles in need of repair that have been brought onto your property must be contained so that fluids do not leak onto the ground. No used oil or automotive fluids should escape the facility, be poured, or swept onto the ground or into any storm drains. Fluids should be sent offsite for recycling regularly in order to avoid stockpiling them. Third, all employees should be trained on the above-described procedures. You should monitor the used oil storage area to ensure that procedures are being followed, and take corrective measures if they are not.
- B. Angles Garage has a parts washer that is serviced by Safety Kleen. As documentation to ensure that spent solvent is being properly managed by your company, please send me a copy of the most recent receipt for removal of spent solvent by Safety Kleen.
- C. There is a large drain on the concrete floor inside the repair garage. During the investigation, you were unable to provide information as to where this drain leads or what it is. Please contact the building owner to get this information and provide it to me. Please note that if it is a storm drain, Ohio EPA recommends that this drain be sealed so that no automotive fluids can enter it.

Your company must immediately take the necessary measures to return to compliance with Ohio's environmental laws. Within **21 days** of the date of this letter, your company is requested to provide documentation to this office including the steps taken to abate the violations and address comments cited above. Documentation of steps taken to return to compliance includes written correspondence, updated policies, and photographs, as appropriate, and may be submitted via the postal service or electronically to [donna.goodman@epa.state.oh.us](mailto:donna.goodman@epa.state.oh.us).

Please be advised that violations cited above will continue until the violations have been properly abated. Failure to comply with Chapter 3734. of the Ohio Revised Code and rules promulgated thereunder, may result in a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 per day for each violation. It is imperative that you return to compliance. If circumstances delay the abatement of violations, your company is requested to submit written correspondence of the steps that will be taken by date certain to attain compliance.
