Dear Mr. Bowers:

On August 27, 2009 this writer conducted an inspection of your facility to determine compliance with your Industrial General Stormwater NPDES permit referenced above. The following observations were made:

General

Sonoco Phoenix located at 3075 Brookline Rd., North Canton, Stark County produces easy open Tin lids. Wastewater produced is sent to the City of Canton WWTP. Potable water is supplied by the City of North Canton WTP.

Inspection observations

- 1) The exterior of the site is relatively clean. Dumpsters containing scrap tin are uncovered, but upon visual inspection there were no residual oils associated with this scrap. It would still be advisable to always cover any dumpster, limiting exposure to rainwater.
- 2) There are three stormwater discharges from the site. Two on the east side and one on the west side of the property. Both discharge to unnamed tributaries which flow to the south and eventually connect to Zimber Ditch.
- 3) It had not been raining recently and there was no flow in the storm sewers leaving the site.
- 4) A review of your SWPPP plan at your facility indicated that a very comprehensive plan has been put together. It appeared to address all significant items required by your General Stormwater permit referenced above.
