Subject: Failure to Sample Drinking Water for Lead and Copper at Taps

MURRAY CITY VILLAGE PWS is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code Rule (OAC) 3745-81-86 for failing to comply with the lead and copper tap water monitoring requirements.

ACTION REQUIRED:

4. **Notify the people served by this water system** as soon as practical, but no later than one year after learning of the violation, using one or more of the methods listed below to reach all persons served as required by OAC Rule 3745-81-32.

Methods:

- Mail or other direct delivery to each customer; or
- Annual Consumer Confidence Report provided it's distribution is within one year after learning of the violation; and
- If necessary to reach all persons regularly served, use other notification methods such as newspaper publication, public posting or internet posting.

Do not make changes to the public notice without first consulting with the Ohio EPA.

5. **Complete the enclosed Verification Form within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice** and mail it to this office at Ohio EPA, DDAGW-Central Office, PO Box 1049, Columbus, OH 43216-1049. Include a copy of each notice type distributed, published or posted.
6. **To return to compliance for lead and copper tap monitoring**, monitor according to your next issued Contaminant Monitoring Distribution Point Schedule.

If lead and copper samples were collected as required, contact your laboratory to have sample results submitted and submit EPA Form 5105 with appendix to this office as soon as possible. EPA Form 5105 with appendix and the instructions for filling out this form are available at: www.epa.ohio.gov/ddagw/reporting.aspx#Forms.
