Dear Mr. Myers & Mr. Rasmussen:

On July 22, 2010, Judson Delancey inspected the Brint Road & Mitchaw Road Intersection Roundabout in Sylvania Township. The purpose of the visit was to evaluate compliance of the site with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for storm water discharges associated with construction activity, Facility ID No. 2GC023339*AG. The inspection was conducted under the provisions of Ohio's water pollution control statutes, Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Chapter 6111. Mr. Jim Dowling, Field Superintendent, with Geddis Paving and Excavating Inc., was present to provide information on the project. A copy of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan was available. According to our records, you are Co-Permittees at this site.


At the time of inspection, construction at the site was ongoing. The road had been torn up and drainage pipes were being put into place. The inlet protection has been built for when the yard inlets are finished. As of right now the storm water just settles into the ground on site. Mr. Dowling said that he will be seeding the right of way as he goes. The site appeared to be in compliance.

Please send a written response describing what post construction storm water management practices are being/will be implemented at the site within **10 days** of the date on this letter. The permit requires that post-construction Best Management Practices (BMPs) are installed during construction to control pollutants in the storm water discharges that will occur after construction has concluded. Such practices may include, but are not limited to: storm water extended detention structures; retention structures; water quality swales; and bioretention areas. Your reply should include the type(s) of practices and the basis for their design.
