Dear Mr. Gabriel:

On April 10, 2012, I sent you a letter regarding 38345 Apollo Parkway, Willoughby, Ohio. This letter requested a written response within 14 days and I have not received such a response. A copy of the letter is enclosed. Please call me when you get this letter so that we can discuss this.

In addition, I sent you a second notice of violation on May 17, 2012, and we spoke on the phone about this on May 22, 2012. I went back to this location on June 8, 2012, and took the enclosed photographs. I left you a phone message relating this to you on June 25, 2012. You have not documented a correction of the two violations cited in my April 10, 2012 letter.

You need to immediately take the necessary measures to return to compliance with Ohio's environmental laws. Within 14 days of receipt of this letter, you are requested to provide documentation to me including the steps taken to abate the violations cited above. Such documentation may include written correspondence, updated policies, and photographs, as appropriate.

Please be advised that violations cited above will continue until the violations have been properly abated. Failure to comply with Chapter 3734 (or 3714 for C&DD) of the Ohio Revised Code and rules promulgated thereunder may result in a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 per day for each violation. If circumstances delay the abatement of violations, you are requested to submit written correspondence of the steps that will be taken by date certain to attain compliance.



Dear Gabriel:

On March 29 and 30, 2012, I inspected 38345 Apollo Parkway, Willoughby, Ohio. The purpose of this was to determine if 38345 Apollo Parkway was in compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste, universal waste and used oil laws and rules as found in Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). You told me that you manage this property.

Our records for this location had been for the former Euclid Body and Fender Co. Multiple businesses are at this location. It did not appear that any of them typically generate a hazardous waste. Please see the attached form which will be used to update the records associated with this ID number (OHD018441469).

The following violations were found:

1. **OAC Rule 3745-279-22(D) - Response to releases of used oil.**

This rule requires that upon detection of a release of used oil to the environment, the generator must clean up and manage properly the released used oil and other materials. The following documents are enclosed regarding this:

You violated this rule by having what appeared to be used oil on the ground at this property. You told me that this is from an excavating company that you rent to and who will be moving out at the end of the month. Photographs of this are enclosed. This contaminated soil/gravel must now be removed and disposed of properly. If it is only contaminated with used oil then it may be disposed of as a solid waste. **Send me a photograph showing that this has been done.**

2. **OAC Rule 3745-27-05(C) - Open dumping of solid waste.**

This rule prohibits the open dumping of solid waste and requires the proper removal and disposal of any open dumped solid waste.

You violated this rule by allowing the open dumping of the solid waste and scrap tires shown in the enclosed photograph. **These wastes must now be properly cleaned up and disposed. Send me a photograph showing this has been done and documentation (such as pickup receipts) showing these wastes have been properly disposed.**


