





Subject: 2009 Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) Violations (Type 72)

Dear Mr. Marcum:

Ohio EPA-Northwest District Office (NWDO) received the 2009 CCR for the Crawford County Sewer District No. 2 on June 15, 2010. Based on our review, the Crawford County Sewer District No. 2 PWS is in violation of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rules 3745-96-01 through 04 for failure to comply with all of the CCR requirements. The following violations were noted:

1. The status of your license to operate a PWS was not included. The following statement was to have been included for 'GREEN' colored licenses issued in 2010:

"We have a current, unconditioned license to operate our water system."

2. A section of required additional health information [OAC rule 3745-96-03 (D)] regarding lead educational information was omitted. The following paragraph was to have been included in the CCR:

"If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. The Crawford County Sewer District No. 2 public water system is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested."



Be sure to correct the violations as needed in your next CCR. As a reminder, the report for calendar year 2010 must be sent to your customers by no later than July 1, 2011. A copy of the CCR and a completed Certification Form must be submitted to NWDO by no later than July 1, 2011.
