Subject: CCR Violations

Dear Mr. Phillips:

Ohio EPA received the 2008 Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) for the Village of Oakwood water system on July 8, 2009. The CCR was reviewed for the required content. Based on our review, the Village of Oakwood water system is in violation of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rules 3745-96-01 through 04 for failure to comply with the CCR requirements. The following violation was noted:

1. The report incorrectly reported the source water susceptibility to contamination as low. The Drinking Water Source Assessment issued in September 2002 (abbreviated report enclosed) reported a HIGH susceptibility to contamination because water quality results indicated the presence of volatile organic compounds implying a pathway exists from the ground surface to the aquifer. OAC Rule 3745-96-02(B)(2) requires where a community water system has received a source water assessment summary from the director, the report shall include a brief summary of the community water system's susceptibility to potential sources of contamination, using language provided by the director or equivalent language written by the operator.

Be sure to correct the violation as appropriate in your next CCR. The next report for calendar year 2009 must be sent to your customers by no later than July 1, 2010. A copy of the CCR, along with a Certification Form, must be submitted to the Northwest District Office at the above address. Violations in future reports may result in further enforcement action.
