



**Subject: Notice of Violation –
Failure to Sample Drinking Water for Lead and Copper**

The Village of Continental public water system is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), Rule 3745-81-86 for failure to comply with the monitoring requirements for Lead and Copper. To ensure the safety of drinking water provided by your system monitoring for lead and copper is essential.

Compliance Period: Triennial
Monitoring Period: June 1 – September 30, 2008
Population: 1250
Sites Required: 10 sites
Results Submitted: 10 sites sampled, 4 rejected
see separate letter dated October 22, 2008

ACTION REQUIRED:

1. **Notify the people served by this water system** using one or more of the methods and the timing as required by OAC, Rule 3745-81-32 to reach all persons served. The appropriate methods for your system are listed below under the **Community** column.

Posted notices must remain in place as long as the violation or situation exists, but in no case less than seven days (even if the violation is resolved). The language in italics on the enclosed public notice is mandatory and must be included, as written. Do not make changes to the public notice without consulting with the Ohio EPA beforehand.	

2. **Complete the enclosed Verification Form within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice** and mail it to Ohio EPA - Northwest District Office. Include a copy of each notice distributed, published or posted.
3. **To return to compliance**, sample ten (10) sites between June 1 and September 30, 2009. The report is due by October 10, 2009. This will **not** appear on your 2009 Chemical Monitoring Schedule.

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

Monitoring requirements were not met for Village of Continental

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During June 1 - September 2008, we "did not monitor or test" or "did not complete all monitoring or testing" for lead and copper and, therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.

What Should I Do?

- *There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective action.*
- *This notice is to inform you that Continental did not monitor and report results for the presence of lead and copper in the public drinking water system during the June 1- September 30, 2008 time period, as required by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.*

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PUBLIC NOTICE INSTRUCTIONS AND VERIFICATION FORM FOR COMMUNITY PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS WITH TIER 3 VIOLATIONS

The owner or operator of a community public water system with a Tier 3 violation or situation shall notify the persons served by the public water system as soon as practical but **no later than one year** after the system learns of the violation. At a minimum, community public water systems must issue the notice by **mail or other direct delivery**. Public notice issued by methods other than posting shall be repeated annually as long as the violation or situation persists.
