

NOTICE OF VIOLATION – ACTION REQUIRED

Subject: Failure to Sample Drinking Water for Lead and Copper as Required

Mennonite Christian School is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), Rule 3745-81-86 for failure to comply with the lead and copper monitoring requirements.

Compliance Period:	January 1, 2008-December 31, 2010
Monitoring Period:	June 1 - September 30, 2010
Population:	66
Sites Required:	5

To ensure the safety of drinking water provided by your system, monitoring for lead and copper is essential.

ACTION REQUIRED:

- Notify the people served by this water system** using one or more of the methods and the timing as required by OAC, Rule 3745-81-32 to reach all persons served. The appropriate methods for your system are listed below under the **NTNC** column.



2. **Complete the enclosed Verification Form within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice and mail it to the Ohio EPA, Northwest District Office. Include a copy of each notice distributed, published or posted.**
3. **To return to compliance for lead and copper**, monitor from five (5) sites between June 1-September 30, 2011. The report is due by October 10, 2011. This will **not** appear on your 2011 Chemical Monitoring Schedule.

If lead and copper samples were collected as required, submit forms EPA 5105, 5106 and 5107 along with the sample analysis reports to this office as soon as possible. The monitoring violation will be rescinded and a reporting violation given for late submittal of the results.



DRINKING WATER NOTICE

Monitoring requirements not met for Mennonite Christian School

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During June 1- September 30, 2010, we "did not monitor or test" or "did not complete all monitoring or testing" for lead and copper and, therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.

What Should I Do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective action.
- This notice is to inform you that Mennonite Christian School did not monitor and report results for the presence of lead and copper in the public drinking water system during the June 1 – September 30, 2010 time period, as required by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

What is being done?

The water supplier will take steps to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the future.

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Tier 3: Monitoring Violation Notice

**PUBLIC NOTICE INSTRUCTIONS AND VERIFICATION FORM FOR
NONCOMMUNITY PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS WITH TIER 3 VIOLATIONS**

The owner or operator of a noncommunity public water system with a Tier 3 violation or situation shall notify the persons served by the public water system as soon as practical but **no later than 30 days** after the system learns of the violation. Public notice issued by posting shall remain in place as long as the violation or situation persists. Public notice issued by other methods shall be repeated annually as long as the violation or situation persists.
