

Kalmbach Feeds, Inc. is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), Rule 3745-81-86 for failure to comply with the lead and copper monitoring requirements.



2. **Complete the enclosed Verification Form within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice** and mail it to Ohio EPA - Northwest District Office. Include a copy of each notice distributed, published or posted.
3. **To return to compliance for lead and copper**, monitor from five (5) sites between June 1 and September 30, 2009. The report is due by October 10, 2009. This will **not** appear on your 2009 Chemical Monitoring Schedule.

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

Monitoring requirements were not met for Kalmbach Feeds

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During June 1 to September 30, 2008, we "did not monitor or test" or "did not complete all monitoring or testing" for lead and copper monitoring, and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.

What Should I Do?

- *There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective action.*

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**PUBLIC NOTICE INSTRUCTIONS AND VERIFICATION FORM FOR
NONCOMMUNITY PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS WITH TIER 3 VIOLATIONS**

The owner or operator of a non-community public water system with a Tier 3 violation or situation shall notify the persons served by the public water system as soon as practical but **no later than 30 days** after the system learns of the violation, unless the notice is included with the next bill to customers, then the notice shall be distributed no later than 90 days from the date of the violation. Public notice issued by posting shall remain in place as long as the violation or situation persists. Public notice issued by other methods shall be repeated annually as long as the violation or situation persists.
