Step 2	<p>Within ten (10) days of completing Step 1 above, fill out the enclosed verification form and send it and a copy of the public notification issued to the Northwest District Office of Ohio EPA.</p>

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

Monitoring requirements not met for Norada Lanes

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During January - March 2007 we did not monitor for total coliform and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What Should I Do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective action.

This notice is to inform you that Norada Lanes did not monitor and report results for the presence of total coliform in the public drinking water system during the January - March 2007 time period, as required by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

What is being done?

Upon being notified of this violation, the water supply was required to have the drinking water analyzed for the above mentioned parameters. The water supplier will take steps to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the future.
