NOTICE OF VIOLATION – ACTION REQUIRED

Subject: Failure to Sample Drinking Water for Total Coliforms as Required

Oak Openings Metropark - Evergreen Lake is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), Rule 3745-81-21 for failure to comply with total coliform monitoring requirements.

Monitoring Period: January – March 2008
Required Coliform Monitoring: One (1) sample per quarter
Sample Results Submitted: None

To ensure the safety of drinking water provided by your system monitoring for total coliforms is essential.

ACTION REQUIRED:

1. **Notify the people served by this water system** using one or more of the methods and the timing as required by OAC, Rule 3745-81-32 to reach all persons served. The appropriate methods for your system are listed below under the **Transient Non-Community** column.

Posted notices must remain in place as long as the violation or situation exists, but in no case less than seven days (even if the violation is resolved). The language in italics on the enclosed public notice is mandatory and must be included, as written. Do not make changes to the public notice without consulting with the Ohio EPA beforehand.

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2. **Complete the enclosed Verification Form within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice** and mail it to Ohio EPA – Northwest District Office. Include a copy of each notice distributed, published or posted.

If total coliform samples were collected as required, submit the results as soon as possible. The monitoring violation would be rescinded and a reporting violation given for late submittal of the results.

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

Monitoring requirements were not met for Oak Openings Metropark - Evergreen Lake

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During January – March 2008, we "did not monitor or test" or "did not complete all monitoring or testing" for total coliform bacteria, and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.

What Should I Do?

- *There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective action.*
- *This notice is to inform you that Oak Openings Metropark - Evergreen Lake did not monitor and report results for the presence of total coliform bacteria in the public drinking water system during the January – March 2008 time period, as required by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.*

What is being done?

Upon being notified of this violation, the water supply was required to have the drinking water analyzed for the above mentioned parameters. The water supplier will take steps to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the future.
