**I. JURISDICTION**

These Director's Final Findings and Orders ("Orders") are issued to Scott Dear ("Respondent") pursuant to the authority vested in the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("Ohio EPA") under Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") §§ 3704.03 and 3745.01.

**II. PARTIES BOUND**

These Orders shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent and heirs and successors in interest liable under Ohio law.

**III. DEFINITIONS**

Unless otherwise stated, all terms used in these Orders shall have the same meaning as defined in ORC Chapter 3704 and the rules promulgated thereunder.

**IV. FINDINGS**

The Director of Ohio EPA has determined the following findings:

1. Respondent owns the property located on 11481 Township Road 108 in Allen Township, Hancock County, Ohio. The property is located in an "unrestricted area" as defined in Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") Rule 3745-19-01(K).
2. OAC Rule 3745-19-04(A) prohibits any property owner or person from causing or allowing "open burning," as defined in OAC Rule 3745-19-01(H), in an unrestricted area except as otherwise provided in OAC Rule 3745-19-04(B) to (D) and ORC § 3704.11.
3. OAC § 3704.05(G) states, in part, that no person shall violate any order, rule, or determination of the Director issued, adopted, or made under ORC Chapter 3704. OAC Chapter 3745-19 was adopted by the Director pursuant to OAC Chapter 3704.
4. On February 22, 2008, an inspector for Ohio EPA observed Respondent burning residential trash, three console televisions, miscellaneous metal scraps, several tree limbs,

and assorted brush at the property. The items were burned within a fiberglass hulled fishing boat approximately 12-15 feet in length. Since the burning occurred during improper atmospheric conditions and within 1000 feet of a residence not located at the property, the exceptions to the open burning prohibition were not applicable. Therefore, the open burning was in violation of OAC Rule 3745-19-04(A) and ORC § 3704.05(G).

5. On February 28, 2008, Ohio EPA sent a Notice of Violation letter to Respondent for the open burning violation identified above. Respondent received the letter, and in his response letter which was received on March 18, 2008, he claimed ignorance of the law and concluded the letter by indicating that "it will not happen again."

6. Based on the above Findings, the Director of Ohio EPA finds that, on February 22, 2008, Respondent violated OAC Rule 3745-19-04(A) which prohibits open burning in unrestricted areas.

7. OAC Rule 3745-19-06(A) states that the Director of Ohio EPA may assess a violator not more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) per day for each separate violation of the rules in this Chapter for open burning on residential property. The violation that occurred on February 22, 2008 is being assessed this penalty.

8. Should Respondent fail to comply with these Orders, the Director of Ohio EPA may refer this matter to the Ohio Attorney General's Office where, under the authority of ORC § 3704.06, the Director may request that the Attorney General pursue litigation and seek civil penalties of up to \$25,000 per day of violation.

9. The Director has given consideration to, and based his determination on, evidence relating to the technical feasibility and economic reasonableness of complying with the following Orders and their relation to benefits to the people of the State be derived from such compliance.

## **V. ORDERS**

The Director hereby issues the following Orders:

1. Upon the effective date of these Orders, Respondent shall achieve compliance with the requirements of OAC Chapter 3745-19 and shall maintain compliance thereafter.

2. Within thirty (30) days after the effective date of these Orders, Respondent shall pay Ohio EPA the amount of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) in administrative penalties pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-19-06. Payment shall be made by an official check made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio" for \$250. The official check shall be submitted to Brenda Case, or her successor, with a letter identifying the Respondent, to:

#### **VI. TERMINATION**

Respondent's obligations under these Orders shall terminate upon Ohio EPA's receipt of the official check required by Section V of these Orders.

#### **VII. OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS**

All actions required to be taken pursuant to these Orders shall be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of all applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations. These Orders do not waive or compromise the applicability and enforcement of any other statutes or regulations applicable to Respondent.

#### **VIII. RESERVATION OF RIGHTS**

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent Ohio EPA from seeking legal or equitable relief to enforce the terms of these Orders or from taking other administrative, legal or equitable action as deemed appropriate and necessary, including seeking penalties against Respondent for noncompliance with these Orders and/or for the violations described herein. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent Ohio EPA from exercising its lawful authority to require Respondent to perform additional activities pursuant to ORC Chapter 3704 or any other applicable law in the future. Nothing herein shall restrict the right of Respondent to raise any administrative, legal or equitable claim or defense with respect to such further actions which Ohio EPA may seek to require of Respondent. Nothing in these Orders shall be construed to limit the authority of Ohio EPA to seek relief for violations not addressed in these Orders.

**IX. EFFECTIVE DATE**

The effective date of these Orders is the date these Orders are entered into the Ohio EPA Director's journal.
