**Re: NOTICE OF VIOLATION: OHIO ADMINISTRATIVE CODE 3745-17-08 (B);
RESTRICTION OF EMISSION OF FUGITIVE DUST FROM SANDBLASTING
OPERATIONS.**

Dear Mr. Wilson:

The Canton City Health Department, Air Pollution Control Division (APCD) represents the Ohio EPA in air quality matters within Stark County. As such, APCD employees are charged with the responsibility to investigate and enforce Ohio EPA (OEPA) air pollution regulations. APCD employees are authorized under Ohio Revised Code 3704.03 (L) to enter upon private property to determine if there is noncompliance with OEPA regulations.

This Agency recently received an anonymous complaint alleging emissions of fugitive dust coming from the sandblasting work performed at your commercial property located at 7932 Lincoln ST E, East Canton, OH 44730. The evidence of emissions was the result of sandblasting miscellaneous metal parts performed outdoors without any fugitive dust control measures. The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the fugitive dust regulations and controls you **MUST** employ in order to prevent fugitive dust emissions and associated violations. The following regulations should be complied with:

- A) Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 3745-15-07 declares that it is unlawful for any person to cause, permit or maintain a public nuisance. The emission into the open air of dust and grit from a sandblasting operation can be considered a public nuisance. Please see the enclosed copy.
- B) OAC 3745-17-07 (B) states the visible particulate emission limitations for fugitive dust sources other than stacks. Subsection (1) would include media-blasting operations such as the Volcanic Heater facility, and limits the visible emissions of fugitive dust to not exceeding 20% opacity as a three minute average. Please see the enclosed copy of OAC 3745-17-07.
