**Re: OPEN BURNING COMPLAINT FROM 09/25/2007 AND CITY OF CANTON CODIFIED
ORDINANCES WITH REGARD TO RECREATIONAL FIRES**

Dear Mr. Henderhan:

Recently, an alleged illegal open burning was reported to the Canton Air Pollution Control Division, a Stark County representative for the Ohio EPA. It was forwarded from the Canton City Fire Department. Upon the arrival of the Canton City Fire Department to your residence on 09/25/2007, they discovered that you were burning illegal materials including insulation off wiring in the back yard. Per their request, you had poured water on the smoldering fire debris. A member of this office investigated the complaint and talked with you concerning this matter.

Because you are located in a restricted area, open burning is prohibited except for very specific and minimal allowances with special conditions per the enclosed Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule 3745-19-03 and the City of Canton Codified Ordinances 1513.02 and 1513.03. Any open burning on your property will be a violation of this regulation if all requirements are not met.

- 1. Application for approval of recreational fires shall be verbally submitted to the Fire Prevention Bureau at least forty-eight (48) hours before the fire is set. If a recreational fire is planned for a weekend or holiday, notification shall be given by 4:00 p.m. Friday or by 4:00 p.m. on the last business day before the holiday.**
- 2. The material shall be of the minimum size for the intended purpose, consist only of seasoned dry firewood and be ignited with a small quantity of paper. The fuel shall be chosen to minimize the generation and emission of air contaminants.**
- 3. They are not to be used for waste disposal purposes; and**
- 4. A recreational fire shall not be more than 2 ft. x 2 ft. x 2 ft. in dimension and shall not be permitted to burn longer than three (3) hours, unless**

approved by the Fire Prevention Bureau. All recreational fires shall be extinguished by 11:00 p.m.

5. The location of the fire shall not be less than fifty (50) feet from any structure.
6. A recreational fire shall be constantly attended until the fire is completely extinguished. Approved extinguishing equipment shall be available for immediate utilization at all times.

If you wish to properly dispose of freshly cut branches, grass, shrubs, leaves, and stumps, there are conveniently located recycling stations throughout Stark County. Enclosed are the open burning regulations for your information, and locations of yard waste collection sites.
