Re: Facility Pretreatment Inspection

Dear Mr. Deeds:

Thank you for taking time to meet with me on Tuesday, September 25, 2007. The purpose of the site visit was to evaluate your compliance with the Ohio EPA indirect discharge permit conditions and pretreatment requirements. During the site visit we also reviewed and discussed industrial storm water items.

Attached you will find my report and observations from the site visit. The following items were identified.

1. The PTI #06-7427 was issued for the installation of a 10,000 gallon tank and a 20,000 gallon tank. Only the 10,000 gallon tank was installed due to the fact that the CD&D landfill is no longer in operation nor has its license.
2. During the last year, leachate was taken to the City of Lancaster, which has an approved pretreatment program, every time except once. Leachate was once inadvertently taken to the City of Bremen. If leachate is hauled only to the City of Lancaster's WWTP, an indirect discharge permit will not be required. If leachate will be hauled to the City of Bremen, the indirect discharge permit will be required.

The following actions are required by Tunnel Hill Reclamation LLC.

1. Determine if leachate will only be taken to the City of Lancaster. If so, Tunnel Hill Reclamation LLC may request termination of the indirect discharge permit.

2. If Tunnel Hill Reclamation LLC decides to continue with an indirect discharge permit, then you may dispose of leachate at treatment plants without approved programs, i.e., City of Bremen. You must then apply for a *permit renewal by January of 2009*.
3. If Tunnel Hill Reclamation LLC decides not to continue with an indirect discharge permit, then a notice of termination must be submitted to terminate the permit. If the permit is terminated, leachate may only be disposed at plants with approved programs, i.e., City of Lancaster and City of Circleville.

Ohio EPA looks forward to working with Tunnel Hill Reclamation to ensure continuing compliance with pretreatment requirements and the indirect discharge permit.
