A review of your self-monitoring reports for the referenced facility covering the months of March, 2004 through April, 2007 indicates violations of the conditions of your NPDES permit. The specific instances of noncompliance are as follows:

Please be advised that failure to comply with the effluent limitations and/or monitoring requirements, including adequate laboratory controls, appropriate quality assurance procedures, and records retention, as specified in Part III - General Conditions of your NPDES permit may be cause for enforcement action pursuant to Ohio Revised Code, Chapter 6111. If these violations continue to occur and if satisfactory progress is not made, it may be necessary to initiate enforcement action to achieve compliance.


