WARNING LETTER

Dear Mrs. Fry:

On September 10, 2012, the Regional Air Pollution Control Agency (RAPCA) received a citizen complaint regarding smoke and odors from the open burning of brush **across the street from 213 Lyle Road, and west of 222 Lyle Road** in Springfield, OH. The complainant stated that heavy smoke and odor was originating from this property for long periods of time and had concerns of the health effects from the smoke and odors from this property.

As a result of this complaint, RAPCA performed an inspection at your property on September 10, 2012 and documented a large fire containing wood and brush being actively burned for waste disposal by Mr. Randy Baughman and Mr. Steve Ray. As the property owner, you are responsible for this property.

This open burning is a violation of the following regulations:

- 1) Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule: 3745-19-03, Open Burning in a Restricted Area.
- 2) Clark County Combined Health District Air Pollution Control Regulations (CCCHDAPCR) rule: 3745-19-03, Open Burning in a Restricted Area.

RAPCA also contacted the Springfield Township Fire Department to make them aware of this complaint.



This letter serves as an official warning from the Regional Air Pollution Control Agency to cease all open burning in violation of both state and local air pollution control regulations.
