**I. JURISDICTION**

These Director's Final Findings and Orders ("Orders") are issued to Ms. Vicky Walls ("Respondent") pursuant to the authority vested in the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("Ohio EPA") under Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") §§ 3704.03 and 3745.01.

**II. PARTIES BOUND**

These Orders shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent and heirs and successors in interest liable under Ohio law.

**III. DEFINITIONS**

Unless otherwise stated, all terms used in these Orders shall have the same meaning as defined in ORC Chapter 3704 and the rules promulgated thereunder.

**IV. FINDINGS**

The Director of Ohio EPA has determined the following findings:

1. Respondent owns the residential property located at 10141 State Route 73 in New Vienna, Highland County, Ohio. This property is located within an "unrestricted area" as defined in Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") Rule 3745-19-01(K) of Ohio's open burning rules.

2. OAC Rule 3745-19-04(A) prohibits "open burning," as defined in OAC Rule 3745-19-01(H), in an unrestricted area except as otherwise provided in OAC Rule 3745-19-04(B) and (C) and ORC § 3704.11. The provisions of OAC Rule 3745-19-04(B) and (C) and ORC § 3704.11 do not provide for the open burning solid waste within one thousand feet of any inhabited building not located on the property in an unrestricted area.

3. ORC § 3704.05(G) states, in part, that no person shall violate any order, rule, or determination of the Director issued, adopted, or made under ORC Chapter 3704. OAC Chapter 3745-19 was adopted by the Director pursuant to ORC Chapter 3704. 2. ORC § 3704.05(G) states, in part, that no person shall violate any order, rule, or determination of

the Director issued, adopted, or made under ORC Chapter 3704. The rules in OAC Chapter 3745-19 were adopted by the Director under OAC Chapter 3704.

4. On September 17, 2009, Respondent conducted open burning at 10141 State Route 73, in violation of OAC Rule 3745-19-04(A). The Clinton-Highland Joint Fire Department responded to the incident and observed the burning of rubbish, and trash. The fire department extinguished the fire. In response to a complaint received October 14, 2009, an Ohio EPA inspector subsequently visited the site on October 23, 2009, and left informational brochures regarding Ohio's open burning regulations with Respondent's son.

5. In response to a complaint received March 22, 2010, regarding open burning of tires and solid waste at Respondent's property, an Ohio EPA visited the site again on March 24, 2010. The inspector observed a large burn area on the property where solid waste and tires had been burned within one thousand feet of an inhabited building not located on the Respondent's property, in violation of OAC Rule 3745-19-04. A Notice of Violation ("NOV") was sent to Respondent on March 30, 2010.

6. In response to a complaint received April 8, 2010, regarding open burning of tires and solid waste at Respondent's property, on April 9, 2010, an Ohio EPA again visited the site. The inspector observed a large burn area on the property where solid waste, tires, and wire had been burned. Several additional burn areas were also observed on the property. All of the burn areas were within one thousand feet of an inhabited building not located on the Respondent's property, in violation of OAC Rule 3745-19-04. A second NOV was sent to Respondent on April 12, 2010.

7. Based on the above Findings, the Director of Ohio EPA finds that Respondent violated the following ORC law and OAC rule:

- ORC § 3704.05(G), for violating a rule the Director adopted under ORC Chapter 3704; and
- OAC Rule 3745-19-04 which prohibits open burning for disposal of solid waste containing rubber or petroleum products and open burning within one thousand feet of an inhabited building not located on the property.

8. OAC Rule 3745-19-06(A) states that the Director of Ohio EPA may assess a violator not more than two hundred fifty dollars per day for each separate violation of the rules in this Chapter for open burning on residential property.

9. Should Respondent fail to comply with these Orders, the Director of Ohio EPA may refer this matter to the Ohio Attorney General's Office where, under the authority of the Ohio Revised Code § 3704.06, the Director may request that the Attorney General pursue litigation and seek civil penalties of up to \$25,000 per day of violation.

10. The Director has given consideration to, and based his determination on, evidence relating to the technical feasibility and economic reasonableness of complying with the following Orders and the benefits to the people of the State to be derived from such compliance.

## **V. ORDERS**

The Director hereby issues the following Orders:

1. Upon the effective date of these Orders, Respondent shall achieve compliance with the requirements of OAC Chapter 3745-19 and shall maintain compliance thereafter.

2. Within thirty (30) days after the effective date of these Orders, Respondent shall pay Ohio EPA the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500) in administrative penalties pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-19-06. Payment shall be made by an official check made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio" for \$500. The official check shall be submitted to Brenda Case, or her successor, with a letter identifying the Respondent, to:

## **VI. TERMINATION**

Respondent's obligations under these Orders shall terminate upon Ohio EPA's receipt of the official check required by Section V of these Orders.

## **VII. OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS**

All actions required to be taken pursuant to these Orders shall be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of all applicable local, State and federal laws and regulations. These Orders do not waive or compromise the applicability and enforcement of any other statutes or regulations applicable to Respondent.

### **VIII. RESERVATION OF RIGHTS**

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent Ohio EPA from seeking legal or equitable relief to enforce the terms of these Orders or from taking other administrative, legal or equitable action as deemed appropriate and necessary, including seeking penalties against Respondent for noncompliance with these Orders and/or for the violations described herein. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent Ohio EPA from exercising its lawful authority to require Respondent to perform additional activities pursuant to ORC Chapter 3704 or any other applicable law in the future. Nothing herein shall restrict the right of Respondent to raise any administrative, legal or equitable claim or defense with respect to such further actions which Ohio EPA may seek to require of Respondent. Nothing in these Orders shall be construed to limit the authority of Ohio EPA to seek relief for violations not addressed in these Orders.

### **IX. EFFECTIVE DATE**

The effective date of these Orders is the date these Orders are entered into the Ohio EPA Director's journal.
