Dear Ms. Walker,

On August 11, 2011, agreed upon Director's Final Findings and Orders (Orders) were issued to New Life Tabernacle Ministries. Orders No. 1 and 2 state:

1. From the effective date of these Orders, Respondent shall comply with all current and future contaminant monitoring schedules issued by the Director; and,
2. From the effective date of these Orders, Respondent shall comply with total coliform bacteria monitoring and MCL requirements, in accordance with OAC Rules 3745-81-21 and 3745-81-14, respectively.

On July 30, 2012, a Notice of Violation (NOV) was sent to New Life Tabernacle Ministries for failure to monitor for total coliform during the April 1 to June 30, 2012 monitoring period.

On November 26, 2012, a NOV was sent to New Life Tabernacle Ministries for failure to monitor for four repeat samples after a November 1, 2012 total coliform-positive. This NOV also indicated that a boil order needed to be issued to users of the water system and that five routine total coliform samples would be required the month following the positive result (i.e., December).

As of the date of this letter, Ohio EPA has failed to receive notification of issuance of the boil order, or results from any total coliform monitoring since the November 1, 2012 positive.

Pursuant to the Orders, you are awaiting connection to Southwest Licking Community Water and Sewer District (Southwest Licking W&S). Until this connection is completed and your public water system (PWS) is deactivated, you must comply with the Orders as well as the PWS rules and regulations. To assist New Life Tabernacle Ministries with these regulatory requirements and establish a routine of compliance, Ohio EPA highly recommends that you immediately contract with a certified laboratory to collect and analyze the required samples for your PWS until the date that you have completed the connection to Southwest Licking W&S.

Please be advised that should another monitoring violation occurs while the PWS is under Orders, Ohio EPA will consider additional enforcement action to ensure compliance. Additional enforcement could include civil penalties.
