

Subject: Notice of Violation of failure to monitor for lead and copper

Your public water system incurred a monitoring violation of rule 3745-81-86 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) during the July 1, 2006 to December 31, 2006 monitoring period for failure to collect, analyze and report lead and copper samples as required.

Actions Required As A Result of the Above Violation	
Step 1	<p>Within 30 days issue the attached public notice of the violation in accordance with rule 3745-81-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code by the following methods:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • mail or other direct delivery to each customer receiving a bill and to other service connections; and • if necessary, the system must also use any other method reasonably calculated to reach all persons served by the water system. <p>Note: Systems opting to include the required public notice in the next water bill have up to 90 days.</p> <p>The language in italics on the attached public notice is mandatory and must be included as written.</p>
Step 2	<p>Within ten (10) days of completing Step 1 above, fill out the attached verification form and send along with a copy of the public notification issued to the Southeast District Office of the Ohio EPA.</p>

If samples were not collected during the July 1, 2006 to December 31, 2006, monitoring schedule then your next monitoring period is:

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

Monitoring requirements not met for the Bishopville Water & Sewer Dist #2 PWS

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During July 1, 2006 to December 31, 2006, we "did not monitor or test" or "did not complete all monitoring or testing" for lead and copper and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.

What Should I Do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective action.

This notice is to inform you that the Bishopville Water & Sewer Dist 2 PWS did not monitor and report results for lead and copper parameters in the public drinking water system during the July 1, 2006 to December 31, 2006 time period, as required by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

What is being done?

Upon being notified of this violation, the water supply was required to have the drinking water analyzed for the above mentioned parameters. The water supplier will take steps to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the future.

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Tier 3: Monitoring Violation Notice

PUBLIC NOTICE INSTRUCTIONS AND VERIFICATION FORM FOR COMMUNITY PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS WITH TIER 3 VIOLATIONS

The owner or operator of a community public water system with a Tier 3 violation or situation shall notify the persons served by the public water system as soon as practical but **no later than 30 days** after the system learns of the violation, unless the notice is included with the next bill to customers, then the notice shall be distributed no later than 90 days from the date of the violation. Public notice issued by posting shall remain in place as long as the violation or situation persists. Public notice issued by other methods shall be repeated annually as long as the violation or situation persists.
