Dear Mr. Fox:

On March 1, 2013, Wendy Miller and I conducted a compliance evaluation inspection at Frontier Communications (Frontier) located at 541 Sand Ridge Road, in Bowling Green, Ohio. We inspected Frontier to determine its compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste laws as found in Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). Pollution prevention options were also discussed during this inspection.

Frontier provides internet, phone, and television services for residential and business customers. This Frontier location is the garage where fleet vehicles are serviced. Used oil, antifreeze, and used oil filters are all picked up by Safety Kleen and recycled. One parts washer is serviced by Safety Kleen as part of their continued use program. Spent fluorescent lamps are managed as universal waste and shipped to Veolia where they are recycled. At the time of our inspection, Frontier was operating as a non-generator of hazardous waste.

We found the following violations of Ohio's hazardous waste laws:

**1. OAC Rule 3745-279-22(C)(1): Labeling:**

Containers, aboveground tanks, and fill pipes used for underground storage tanks shall be labeled or marked clearly with the words "used oil."

Frontier had two portable used oil containers in the maintenance shop that were not properly labeled "used oil".

**On March 5, 2013, Frontier submitted, via electronic mail, photographic documentation showing the two portable used oil containers properly labeled with the words "used oil".** A copy of the fact sheet, The Regulation of Used Oil: An Overview for Ohio Businesses Who Generate Used Oil, was given to you at the time of my inspection. Please review this information and contact me if you have any questions.

***With this information, this violation has been abated.***

**2. OAC Rule 3745-273-13(D)(1): Universal Waste: Fluorescent Lamp Management:**

A small quantity handler of universal waste must contain any lamp in containers or packages that are structurally sound, adequate to prevent breakage, and compatible with the contents of the lamps. Such containers and packages must remain closed and must lack evidence of leakage, spillage, or damage that could cause leakage under reasonably foreseeable conditions.

Frontier did not store the spent fluorescent lamps in containers that were closed. Specifically, Frontier had two boxes of spent fluorescent lamps located on the shelf in the storage room that were open.

**At the time of our inspection, Frontier closed the two boxes of spent fluorescent lamps located on the shelf in the storage room.**

***Therefore, this violation is considered abated.***

**3. OAC Rule 3745-273-14(E): Universal Waste: Fluorescent Lamp Labeling:**

Each lamp or a container or package in which such lamps are contained must be labeled or marked clearly with one of the following phrases: "Universal Waste - Lamps", "Waste Lamps" or "Used Lamps".

Frontier did not have the two boxes of spent fluorescent lamps located on the shelf in the storage room properly labeled.

**At the time of our inspection, Frontier properly labeled the two boxes of spent fluorescent lamps located on the shelf in the storage room.**

***Therefore, this violation is considered abated.***

**4. OAC Rule 3745-273-15(A): Accumulation Time for Universal Waste Batteries and Lamps:**

A small quantity handler of universal waste may accumulate universal waste for no longer than one year from the date the universal waste is generated, or received from another handler.

Frontier was not able to demonstrate the length of time the universal waste lamps were being accumulated on-site.

In order to correct this violation, Frontier must immediately ship off-site for recycling the spent fluorescent lamps that have been in storage for greater than one year. Frontier must submit a copy of the receipt for the shipment of spent fluorescent lamps sent off-site for recycling to demonstrate compliance.

**5. OAC Rule 3745-273-15(C): Accumulation Time for Universal Waste Batteries and Lamps:**

A small quantity handler of universal waste who accumulates universal waste shall be able to demonstrate the length of time the universal waste has been accumulated.

Frontier was not able to demonstrate the length of time the universal waste lamps were being accumulated on-site.

In order to correct this violation, Frontier shall establish a written procedure for how you plan to track the length of time the universal waste is accumulated on-site. Frontier shall submit a copy of this procedure to Ohio EPA, NWDO.

**6. OAC Rule 3745-273-16: Universal Waste Employee Training:**

A small quantity handler of universal waste shall ensure that all employees are thoroughly familiar with proper waste handling and emergency procedures, relative to their responsibilities during normal facility operations and emergencies.

Frontier has not ensured that all employees are thoroughly familiar with proper waste handling and emergency procedures.

In order to correct this violation, Frontier must thoroughly familiarize (train) its universal waste fluorescent bulb handlers in proper handling and emergency procedures. Copies of two universal waste guidance documents were given to you at the time of our inspection. Please review this information with your universal waste fluorescent bulb handlers and contact me if you have any questions.

**At the time of our inspection, you stated that you will be the only employee who manages the spent fluorescent lamps. The universal waste requirements were reviewed with you at the time of our inspection. Frontier must ensure that any future employees who are tasked to manage universal waste are properly trained before doing so.**

***Therefore, this violation is considered abated.***

Frontier needs to immediately take the necessary measures to return to compliance with Ohio's environmental laws. Within **14 days** of receipt of this letter, Frontier is requested to provide documentation to this office including the steps taken to abate the violations cited above.

Please be advised that violations cited above will continue until the violations have been properly abated. Failure to comply with Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code and rules promulgated thereunder may result in a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 per day for each violation. It is imperative that you return to compliance. If circumstances delay the abatement of violations, Frontier is requested to submit written correspondence of the steps that will be taken by date certain to attain compliance.
