Subject: Minor Violation of the Consumer Confidence Report Requirements

Ohio EPA received the Village of Somerset's Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) for 2006. The CCR was reviewed for the required content. Based on our review, the Somerset water system is in violation of rules 3745-96-01 through 04 of the Ohio Administrative Code for failure to comply with the CCR requirements. The following violations were noted:

- Some of the data in the Table of Detected Contaminants was not accurate. Specifically:
 - Total Chlorine Residuals was not included.
 - The units specified do not match the result listed for copper. Also, the fact that zero of the ten samples collected were below the action level should be included.
 - The fact that one of the ten samples collected exceeded the action level for lead must be included.
 - The range listed for Total Organic Carbon is incorrect. Somerset recorded values from 1.0 to 2.8 during 2006.
- The required TOC language was not included. A definition of the total organic carbon result should have stated: "The value reported under "Level Found" for Total Organic Carbon (TOC) is the lowest ratio between the percentage of TOC actually removed to the percentage of TOC required to be removed. A value of greater than one (1) indicates that the water system is in compliance with TOC removal requirements. A value of less than one (1) indicates a violation of the TOC removal requirements.

Be sure to correct the violation(s) as appropriate in your next CCR. The next report for calendar year 2007 must be sent to your customers no later than June 30, 2008. A copy of the CCR along with a Certification Form must be submitted to this office no later than July 1, 2008.
