Dear Mr. Brooks:

On January 12, 2011, Wendy Miller and I conducted a compliance evaluation inspection at Steve's Family Auto (hereafter referred to as SFA) located at 26937 Eckel Road in Perrysburg, Ohio. We inspected SFA to determine its compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste laws as found in Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). This letter will explain the violation found and what you need to do to correct this violation.

During our visit, we spoke with you and observed your operations. SFA specializes in complete mechanical repairs for automobiles. You stated that this facility opened for business approximately two years ago. Used oil is generated and stored in a tote located in the shop area. The used oil is picked up by DISC Environmental Services (DISC) and is burned for energy recovery. Used oil filters are hot drained and also picked up by DISC. No painting is done on-site. Heritage/Crystal Clean services your parts washer once every quarter and it is part of the continued use program. Shop rags are laundered by Domestic and tires are picked up by Speck Sales. At the time of our inspection, SFA was operating as a non-generator of hazardous waste.

We found the following violation of Ohio's used oil laws. In order to correct this violation you must do the following and send me the required information within 30 days of your receipt of this letter:

1. OAC Rule 3745-279-22(C)(1): Labeling:

Containers, aboveground tanks, and fill pipes used for underground storage tanks shall be labeled or marked clearly with the words "used oil."

SFA had three portable used oil containers that were not properly labeled.

In order to correct this violation, SFA must properly label the three portable containers with the words "used oil" and submit photographic documentation to Ohio EPA. A copy of the fact sheet, [The Regulation of Used Oil: An Overview for Ohio Businesses Who Generate Use Oil](#), was given to you at the time of our inspection. Please review this information and contact me if you have any questions.

On January 15, 2011, SFA submitted, via electronic mail, a photograph of the three portable used oil storage containers labeled "waste oil only". On January 18, 2011, the Ohio EPA responded to your electronic mail letting you know that the labels on the portable used oil containers did not meet the regulation requirements. This violation has not been abated.

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SFA has not generated any spent fluorescent lamps since they began operations. At the time of our inspection, I informed you about our universal waste rules. These rules apply to your spent fluorescent lamps. If you choose to recycle your spent lamps, you do not have to have them analyzed to determine whether they are hazardous or not. Please be aware that incandescent, fluorescent, metal halide, neon, high-intensity discharge, high-pressure sodium and mercury-vapor lamps could be hazardous waste when discarded. Fluorescent lamps may contain up to 40 milligrams (mg) of mercury, depending on the brand and manufacturer. Lamps may also contain lead and cadmium. Many lamps exhibit a characteristic of toxicity for heavy metals when disposed. A copy of Fluorescent Lamps: What You Should Know, was given to you at the time of our inspection. When you generate spent lamps in the future, you must manage them accordingly.

On January 15, 2011, SFA submitted, via electronic mail, a statement that they have put in place a policy to recycle the spent fluorescent bulbs at Environmental Recycling in Bowling Green, Ohio. Please contact me if you have any questions regarding the proper management of the spent fluorescent bulbs while in storage at your facility prior to recycling.

Ohio EPA will issue an EPA ID number to track our inspection activity. SFA cannot use this number for manifesting hazardous waste shipments. If SFA wants to use an EPA ID number for manifesting and other hazardous waste, used oil or universal waste activities, you must complete and submit a Notification of Regulated Waste Activity form (*EPA Form 9029 (Rev. 11/2002)*) to Ohio EPA. You can obtain this form by contacting the Division of Hazardous Waste Management, Central Office, at (614) 644-2977 or on the Ohio EPA's website www.epa.ohio.gov. This form can also be submitted electronically.
