Subject: Failure to Monitor Drinking Water

Miami East Schools PWS is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code Rule (OAC) 3745-81-24 for failing to monitor your drinking water during the First Quarter of 2013 monitoring period and/or report results for the following contaminants: TOTAL TRIHALOMETHANES (TTHM), HALOACETIC ACIDS, FIVE (HAA5).

In order to return to compliance, Miami East Schools PWS must take the following actions:

1. Notify your customers using the enclosed instructions and public notice.
2. Complete and send a verification form with a copy of the public notice to the mailing address below.
3. Promptly collect your next sample according to your most recent monitoring schedule.
4. Submit the sample for analysis to a certified laboratory on the enclosed list.

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

Monitoring requirements not met for Miami East Schools PWS

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the First Quarter of 2013 time period we did not monitor for the following contaminants and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time:

TOTAL TRIHALOMETHANES (TTHM), HALOACETIC ACIDS, FIVE (HAA5).

What Should I Do?

This notice is to inform you that Miami East Schools PWS did not monitor and report results for the presence of the contaminants listed above in the public drinking water system during the First Quarter of 2013 time period, as required by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency. You do not need to take any actions in response to this notice.

What Is Being Done?

Upon being notified of this violation, the water supply was required to have the drinking water analyzed for the above mentioned parameters. The water supplier will take steps to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the future.

The owner or operator of a noncommunity public water system with a Tier 3 violation or situation shall notify the persons served by the public water system as soon as practical but **no later than 30 days** after the system learns of the violation. Public notice issued by posting shall remain in place as long as the violation or situation persists. Public notice issued by other methods shall be repeated annually as long as the violation or situation persists.
