Subject: Notice of Violation from the Title V Monitoring, Recordkeeping, and Reporting Requirements (1st Semi-annual 2007 Report)

Dear Mr. Griffin:

On August 6, 2007, Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control received the facility's 1st semi-annual/2nd quarter 2007 deviation reports required by the Title V permit issued February 10, 2004. The deviation reports were due on July 31, 2007. The late submittal of deviation reports is a violation of the facility's Title V, Permit Term A.1.c.iii.

In addition, the 1st semi-annual 2007 deviation report submitted by the facility outlined a number of deviations from the monitoring, record keeping, and reporting required by the Title V permit. Ohio EPA is requesting additional information concerning the deviation that were reported in the submitted 1st semi-annual 2007 report. Please provide the following information:

- The Title V Emission Unit ID (example: P233) for each emission unit that deviated from the required permit terms,
- The corresponding Title V Permit Terms which were deviated from with each Emission Unit (example: III.2.a. of EU P235),
- The exact dates which the deviations occurred,
- Probable cause of such deviations; and
- Corrective actions or preventive measures taken



Ormet shall develop a plan and schedule to return the facility to compliance with all applicable air pollution laws. The plan should include the above requested information. Please submit the plan and schedule within 15 days of receiving this letter.

Acceptance by the Ohio EPA of a schedule for compliance does not constitute a waiver of the Ohio EPA's authority to seek civil penalties as provided in section 3704.06 of the Ohio Revised Code. The determination to pursue or decline to pursue such penalties in this case will be made by the Ohio EPA at a later date.
