Dear Mr. Byler:

I am writing this letter in response to a complaint received by this office on May 1, 2007. The complaint alleges that sawdust is being open burned. The sawdust is being generated from your son's sawmill which is located on your property on State Route 379.

On May 8, 2007, I investigated this complaint and spoke to Mr. Reuben Byler, your son. He told me that the fire had been burning since last winter and that two local fire departments had been out to try to put the fire out. The sawdust pile is still quite large and is still burning. I also observed an area behind the mill where wood slabs had been open burned. The sawdust that is being generated now is being put into a trailer and the wood slabs are being banded together and piled up to be sold or given away as campfire wood.

A business cannot open burn any type of wastes that are generated in the course of doing business. The wood wastes cannot be hauled back to the woods and burned as Reuben mentioned. Open burning of wood wastes generated by the sawmill is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule 3745-19-04 and is punishable by a maximum fine of up to \$25,000 per day per violation. All open burning in violation of the requirements specified in OAC rule 3745-19-04 must stop immediately. As the property owner, you can also be held legally responsible for the open burning violations on your property. If improper wood wastes continue to be open burned, legal action may be taken against you. I will be reinspecting the sawmill to ensure compliance with this rule.

A copy of this letter is being forwarded to Ohio EPA's Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management (DSIWM). The information in this letter will be evaluated by DSIWM and further investigation may be initiated if it appears violations within their jurisdiction have occurred.

Dear Mr. Byler:

I am writing this letter in response to a complaint received by this office on May 1, 2007. The complaint alleges that you are open burning sawdust from your sawmill on State Route 379.

On May 8, 2007, I investigated this complaint and spoke to you. You told me that the fire had been burning since last winter and that two local fire departments had been out to try to put the fire out. The sawdust pile is still quite large and is still burning. I also observed an area behind your mill where wood slabs had been open burned. The sawdust that is being generated now is being put into a trailer and the wood slabs are being banded together and piled up to be sold or given away as campfire wood.

A business cannot open burn any type of wastes that are generated in the course of doing business. You cannot haul the wood wastes back to the woods and burn them as you mentioned. Open burning of wood wastes generated by your sawmill is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule 3745-19-04 and is punishable by a maximum fine of up to \$25,000 per day per violation. All open burning in violation of the requirements specified in OAC rule 3745-19-04 must stop immediately. If you continue to open burn improper waste materials, legal action will be taken against you. I will be reinspecting your sawmill to ensure compliance with this rule.

I am requesting a written response from you within 14 days of receipt of this letter that includes a commitment from you to stop open burning in violation of OAC rule 3745-19-04, a plan and schedule for clean up of the burn area and any remaining solid wastes, and a copy of the landfill receipt as proof of proper disposal. Acceptance by Ohio EPA of a schedule for compliance does not constitute a waiver of Ohio EPA's authority to seek civil penalties as provided in section 3704.06 of the Ohio Revised Code. The determination to pursue or to decline to pursue such penalties in this case will be made by Ohio EPA at a later date.
