Dear Mr. Green:

I am writing this letter in response to a complaint received by this office on January 20, 2011. The complaint alleges that tires, a couch, and other waste materials are being burned frequently.

On January 31, 2011, I investigated this complaint and spoke to you and another gentleman at your Francis Road property. Evidence of the open burning of plastics, household trash, garbage and other solid waste materials was observed. As I explained at that time, plastics, garbage, furniture, tires, etc., cannot be open burned anywhere in Ohio. I gave you a pamphlet that explains Ohio's open burning rules.

To open burn residential waste such as paper, leaves, tree trimmings, cardboard, etc., the property must be located in an unrestricted area (as this property is) and the burn site must be at least 1,000 feet from any inhabited building not on your property. Because there is not a burn site location on this property that is at least 1,000 feet from any inhabited building not on the property, you cannot open burn residential waste at this location.


You are permitted to have a cookout or campfire using clean, seasoned firewood if the fire is not more than two feet in height and not more than three feet in diameter. The fire must be put out when the cookout/campfire is over and cannot be left unattended.

Open burning of improper waste materials at this location is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule 3745-19-04 and is punishable by a fine. All open burning in violation of the requirements specified in OAC rule 3745-19-04 must stop immediately. If you continue to open burn improper waste materials, legal action may be taken against you.



Dear Mr. Miller:

I am writing this letter in response to a complaint received by this office on January 20, 2011. The complaint alleges that tire, a couch, and other waste materials are being burned on your rental properties on Francis Road, Lowell.

On January 31, 2011, I investigated this complaint and spoke to both of your tenants, Mr. Jason Green and Ms. Kelly Haines. Evidence of the open burning of household trash, plastics, garbage, and other solid waste materials was observed. As I explained to both of them, plastics, garbage, furniture, tires, etc., cannot be open burned anywhere in Ohio.

On February 1, 2011, I spoke to you by phone to make you aware of the complaint and the open burning that has occurred on your rental properties. You told me that you would tell both tenants that they cannot open burn on your property.

~~To open burn residential waste such as paper, leaves, tree trimmings, cardboard, etc.,~~ the property must be located in an unrestricted area (as your properties are) and the burn site must be at least 1,000 feet from any inhabited building not on the property. Because there is not a burn site location on these properties that is at least 1,000 feet from any inhabited building not on the properties, residential waste cannot be open burned at these locations.


Open burning of improper waste materials at these locations is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule 3745-19-04 and is punishable by a fine. I am enclosing a pamphlet that explains this rule for you. All open burning in violation of the requirements specified in OAC rule 3745-19-04 must stop immediately. If your tenants continue to open burn improper waste materials, legal action may be taken against them for doing the burning and you, as the property owner.

I am requesting a written response from you, within 14 days of receipt of this letter, that includes a commitment from you to stop open burning in violation of OAC rule 3745-19-04 on your Francis Road properties, a plan and schedule for cleanup of the burn area and any remaining solid wastes, and a copy of the landfill receipt as proof of proper disposal. Acceptance by the Ohio EPA of a schedule for compliance does not constitute a waiver of Ohio EPA's authority to seek civil penalties as provided in section 3704.06 of the Ohio Revised Code. The determination to pursue or to decline to pursue such penalties in this case will be made by Ohio EPA at a later date.
