SUBJECT: Notice of violation—failure to meet treatment technique requirements for disinfection by-product precursor removal.

This letter is notification that the city of Greenville public water system is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule 3745-81-77 for failure to monitor for the following parameters during February 2013:

Parameter	Source Water	Treated Water

ACTION REQUIRED:

1. **Notify the people served by this water system** using one or more of the methods and the timing as required by OAC rule 3745-81-32 to reach all persons served. The appropriate methods for your water system are listed below.

Public Community
Timing: As soon as practical, but no later than one year after learning of the violation.
Methods: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mail or hand delivery to each customer; or • Annual Consumer Confidence Report provided it's distributed within one (1) year after learning of the violation; and • If necessary to reach all persons regularly served, use other notification methods such as newspaper publication, public posting or internet posting.
Posted notices must remain in place as long as the violation exists, but in no case less than seven (7) days (even if the violation is resolved). The language in <i>italics</i> on the enclosed public notice is mandatory and must be included, as

written. Do not make changes to the public notice without consulting the Ohio EPA beforehand.

- 2. Complete the enclosed Verification Form within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice** and mail it to Ohio EPA – Southwest District Office, 401 East Fifth Street, Dayton, Ohio 45402-2911. Include a copy of each notice distributed, published or posted.

If total organic carbon samples were collected as required, submit the results as soon as possible. The monitoring violation would be rescinded and a reporting violation given for late submittal of the results.

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

Monitoring requirements not met for the City of Greenville

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During February 2013, we did not monitor or test for total organic carbon and alkalinity and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water at that time.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective action.

This notice is to inform you that the City of Greenville did not monitor and report results for the presence of total organic carbon and alkalinity in the public drinking water system during the February 2013 time period, as required by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

What is being done?

Upon being notified of this violation, the water supply was required to have the drinking water analyzed for the above mentioned parameters. The water supplier will take steps to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the future.

PUBLIC NOTICE INSTRUCTIONS AND VERIFICATION FORM FOR COMMUNITY PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS WITH TIER 3 VIOLATIONS

The owner or operator of a community public water system with a Tier 3 violation or situation shall notify the persons served by the public water system as soon as practical but **no later than one year** after the system learns of the violation. At a minimum, community public water systems must issue the notice by **mail or other direct delivery**. Public notice issued by methods other than posting shall be repeated annually as long as the violation or situation persists.
