Dear Mr. Horton:

On July 9, 2013, Wendy Miller and I conducted a compliance evaluation inspection at Walbridge Automotive (WA) located at 30769 Drouillard Road in Walbridge, Ohio. We inspected WA to determine its compliance with Ohio's hazardous waste laws as found in Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Chapter 3745 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). Pollution prevention options were also discussed during this inspection.

WA is a full-service automotive service shop (i.e. oil changes, wheel alignment, and brakes). WA services fleet vehicles for businesses such as Professional Transportation, Inc. and First Care Ambulance. WA generates used oil which is picked up by Crystal Clean and recycled. Used oil filters are hot drained and managed as a solid waste. Spent batteries are returned to Interstate as part of their battery exchange program. WA has two parts washers that were serviced in the past by DISC Environmental. WA plans to have the parts washers serviced by Crystal Clean in the future. No painting is done at this facility. WA also generates spent fluorescent bulbs, which are managed as universal waste.

At the time of our inspection, WA was operating as a conditionally exempt small quantity generator of hazardous waste.

We found the following violation of Ohio's hazardous waste laws:

1. Labeling: OAC Rule 3745-279-22(C)(1):

Containers, aboveground tanks, and fill pipes used for underground storage tanks shall be labeled or marked clearly with the words "used oil."

WA had two 5-gallon storage buckets and three portable containers of used oil that were not properly labeled.

At the time of our inspection, WA properly labeled the buckets and portable containers with the words "used oil".

Therefore, this violation is considered abated.

A copy of the fact sheet, The Regulation of Used Oil: An Overview for Ohio Businesses Who Generate Used Oil, was given to you at the time of our inspection. In addition, WA may want to consider recycling the used oil filters once they have been properly drained. A list of used oil filter recyclers was given to you at the time of our inspection. Please review this information and contact me if you have any questions.

Ohio EPA will issue an EPA ID number to track our inspection activity. WA cannot use this number for manifesting hazardous waste shipments. If WA wants to use an EPA ID number for manifesting and other hazardous waste, used oil or universal waste activities, you must complete and submit a Notification of Regulated Waste Activity form (*EPA Form 9029 (Rev. 9/5/2010)*) to Ohio EPA.
