Dear Mr. Gabbard:

I am writing this letter in response to a complaint received by this office May 14, 2013. The complaint alleges that a house that served as an office for Starr Parts and Equipment was burned down. Starr Parts and Equipment is a Subsidiary of Company Wrench.

In a notice of violation, dated August 24, 2011, Mr. David Burroughs of Ohio EPA's Central District Office, Division of Air Pollution Control, advised you that the open burning of construction debris that occurred on August 22, 2011, at Company Wrench, 4805 Scooby Lane, Carroll was in violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule 3745-19-04 (A). Mr. Burroughs also spoke to you to inform you of this violation.

Fire reports from the Starr Township Volunteer Fire Department state that on September 6, 2012, the fire department responded to a fire at Starr Parts and Equipment. Tires, rubber and fiberglass were being burned. On May 13, 2013, the fire department responded to another fire at Starr Equipment. The old house that has been used as an office for Starr Parts and Equipment was burned down to make room for a new building. The building was a wood frame structure approximately 30 feet by 40 feet in dimension.

On May 20, 2013, I investigated this complaint and met with Mr. Francis and Mr. Shaben of Starr Parts and Equipment (a subsidiary of Company Wrench). Evidence of the open burning of the house was observed. As I explained at that time, a business cannot burn any type of waste for disposal purposes. Tires, rubber, fiberglass, buildings, demolition and/or construction wastes cannot be open burned anywhere in Ohio.


Open burning of improper waste materials at this location is in violation of OAC rule 3745-19-04 and is punishable by a maximum fine of up to \$25,000 per day per violation. I am enclosing a copy of this rule for you. All open burning in violation of the requirements specified in OAC rule 3745-19-04 must stop immediately.

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I am requesting a written response from you, within 14 days of receipt of this letter, which includes a commitment from Company Wrench and its subsidiaries to stop open burning in violation of OAC rule 3745-19-04, a plan and schedule for cleanup of the burn area and any remaining solid waste materials, and a copy of the landfill receipt as proof of proper disposal. Acceptance by Ohio EPA of a schedule for compliance does not constitute a waiver of Ohio EPA's authority to seek civil penalties as provided in section 3704.06 of the Ohio Revised Code. The determination to pursue or to decline to pursue such penalties in this case will be made by Ohio EPA at a later date.
