Subject: Ground Water Rule Corrective Action Plan Schedule – Notice of Violation

Dear Ms. Steinbrenner:

SOUTHEAST CONSERVATION CLUB - CAMPGROUND is in violation of the Ground Water Rule for failure to respond to our corrective action letter dated August 2, 2013. In that letter (enclosed), you were required to consult with Ohio EPA and submit a corrective action plan and schedule of implementation within 30 days, to address the E. Coli positive results at the water system. Our records indicate that you have not met this requirement.

Ohio EPA is requiring the Southeast Conservation Club- Campground to conduct corrective action according to OAC 3745-81-43. Failure to complete the corrective action may result in enforcement action.

IMMEDIATE ACTION REQUIRED:

To ensure the safety of the consumer, your system must notify your patrons that E. coli has been detected in your source and that you have failed to complete corrective actions plan and schedule of implementation. This public notification must remain posted until the Ohio EPA is satisfied that the corrective actions have been completed.

1. You **must** contact the Ohio EPA Central District Office within **seven (7) days** to discuss your corrective action plan. Your Corrective Actions Plan must:
 - a. Include one or more items proposed in the Corrective Action Letter dated August 2, 2013. Additional items may also be proposed;
 - b. Include a schedule of implementation;

c. **Be approved by Ohio EPA.**

Corrective Actions must be implemented and completed within 120 days (by December 1, 2013) of the date of the corrective action letter, or in accordance with your accepted schedule of implementation.

Failure to complete corrective actions by December 1, 2013 or in accordance with your schedule of implementation may result in enforcement action that can result in fines up to \$25,000 dollars per day.

2. **Issue the enclosed public notice within 24 hours** in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-81-32 using one or more of the following methods to reach all persons served.
 - a. Hand delivery to persons served by the water system;
 - b. Posting in conspicuous locations , such as bulletin boards, restrooms, drinking fountains, vending areas;
 - c. Another delivery method approved in writing by the Director;
 - Posted notices must remain in place for as long as the violation exists, but in no case for less than seven (7) days (even if the violation is resolved). The language in italics on the enclosed public notice is mandatory and must be included, as written. Do not make changes to the public notice without consulting with Ohio EPA beforehand.

NOTE: Issuance of a Public Notice must be repeated every 3 months for as long as the violation exists, unless directed otherwise by the District Office. A verification form and a copy of the public notice, stating the corrective measures completed to date, must be submitted to the Ohio EPA.

3. **Complete the enclosed verification form, within 10 days of issuing the Public Notice** and mail both the 1) verification form and 2) a copy of the public notice to Ohio EPA Central District Office, Division of Drinking and Ground Waters, 50 W. Town Street, Suite 700, PO Box 1049, Columbus, OH, 43215-1049. Include a copy of each notice distributed, published or posted.

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

Failure to consult with Ohio EPA and submit an acceptable corrective action plan and schedule of implementation within 30 days after indication of E. coli/fecal confirmed water sample results

Sampling conducted on **July 8, 2013** for our water system showed fecal bacteria were found in our source (well). We were directed by Ohio EPA on August 2, 2013 to correct the problem. As our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct this situation. As required by Ohio EPA's Ground Water Rule, we were required to contact the Ohio EPA to develop a plan to correct this issue. However, we failed to contact the Ohio EPA or implement a corrective action plan within the established deadline and have violated a requirement of the Ground Water Rule.

What should I do?

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for at least one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation until further notice. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.

Fecal coliforms and E. coli are bacteria whose presence indicates that the water may be contaminated with human or animal wastes. Microbes in these wastes can cause short term effects, diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms. They may pose a special health risk for infants, young children, and people with severely compromised immune systems.

The symptoms above are not caused only by organisms in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice. People at increased risk should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers.

What does this mean?

Inadequately treated or inadequately protected water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms can cause symptoms such as diarrhea, nausea, cramps, and associated headaches. Failure to correct the deficiency according to the established schedule prolonged the risk of fecal contamination of our source water.

What is being done?

PUBLIC NOTICE INSTRUCTIONS AND VERIFICATION FORM FOR TIER 1 VIOLATIONS

The owner or operator of a public water system with a Tier 1 violation or situation that may pose an acute risk to human health is required to notify the persons served by the public water system. Notice shall be issued as soon as practical but **no later than 24 hours** after the system learns of the violation. Public notice shall be repeated as established during consultation with Ohio EPA.
