Re: Class V Injection Well – Chip Bare Autobody

Dear Mr. Bare:

This letter serves as a follow up to the correspondence between Ohio EPA and your office regarding the existence of Class V Injection Wells at Chip Bare Autobody located at 7762 Harrison Avenue, Cincinnati, Ohio. Based on the information you provided, it appears that an unauthorized Class V well(s) exists at Chip Bare Autobody.

The September 21, 2007 letter from Ohio EPA explains that in accordance with Ohio Law, (OAC 3745-34-13(A)) disposal of motor vehicle waste fluids is strictly prohibited. The disposal of wash fluids into a Class V injection well is also prohibited without first applying for and obtaining a Class V Industrial Well Permit to Operate. The inventory form you returned to Ohio EPA and dated 10/31/07 indicates your business has floor drains that lead to an oil water separator and into a septic system. If the floor drains receive any automotive related waste fluids, regardless of the amount, these wells must be abandoned immediately. If the floor drains receive any wash waters, this activity must either be permitted or stopped (i.e. plug the floor drains).

Within thirty days of receipt of this notice, please provide Ohio EPA with a Closure Plan if a motor vehicle waste disposal well exists. In the meantime, no injection is authorized. Should you choose to apply for a Class V Industrial Waste Permit to Operate for injecting wash waters through the floor drain(s), a permit application will be provided upon request. All permit applications require a non-refundable processing fee of \$2,000.
