RE: Triangle Landfill, Inc.

Dear Owner/Operator:

According to Ohio EPA's Underground Injection Control (UIC) records, your facility is operating a Class V Motor Vehicle Waste Disposal (MVWD) well which is defined as a well that receives or has the potential to receive fluid(s) from vehicular repair or maintenance activities. Class V MVWD wells include, but are not limited to, floor drains or shop sinks which connect to a septic system, dry well, or leach field.

As of January 1, 2005, Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-34-13(A) prohibits the discharge of vehicle fluids or wash waters through floor drains or shop sinks into the ground via a septic system, leach field or dry well.

Based on Ohio EPA Class V inventory records, your facility has an illegal Class V MVWD injection well that must be permanently plugged and abandoned. If you believe that our inventory information is no longer correct and your on-lot disposal system (i.e., septic system, dry well, or leach field) receives only sanitary wastes from restrooms or kitchens, please contact us within fourteen (14) days of receipt of this letter so that we may correct this information.

If however, the inventory data is correct, you must cease discharging all MVWD related fluids and permanently plug and abandon the well. You may wish to install a holding tank for these fluids, connect to a sanitary sewer if available, or simply cement all of the connections to the Class V well. You must submit within thirty (30) days, a plan for permanently plugging and abandoning the well as required by OAC Rule 3745-34-13(F). The closure plan must include procedures for the removal of any solids or sludges from the well being closed as well as detailed procedures for plugging the well. Any soil, gravel, sludge, liquids, or other materials removed from or adjacent to the well being closed shall be disposed of or managed in accordance with all applicable federal, state, or local regulations or requirements.


Upon completion of the well closure, the owner or operator of any MVWD well must certify in a report to the Director according to OAC Rule 3745-34-17 that the well was closed in compliance with this rule.
