Dear Mayor and Council:

We are in receipt of your self-monitoring report covering the months of July through September 2011 for the referenced facility. Our review indicates violations of the conditions of your NPDES permit. The specific instances of noncompliance are enclosed on a separate sheet.

We received Mr. Dan Lambert's October 17, 2011, email correspondence and require no further response at this time. Be advised that reporting 0.1 mg/l or <0.1 mg/l is still a violation since the quantification level for chlorine is 0.05 mg/l. We suggest you purchase a chlorine meter that can read results to 0.05 mg/l or have your testing lab run a chlorine test that can analyze to 0.05 mg/l. If those results then come back as non-detectable, you would report "AA 0.05", not <0.05 mg/l.

This letter also serves as a Notice of Violation to inform you that we are missing the discharge monitoring report listed on the enclosed sheet of paper. As a reminder, hard copy self-monitoring report submissions are due on the 15th day of the following month and electronic submissions are due on the 20th day of the following month. Submit the missing report **within 10 days** of the date of this letter. Even if no discharge occurs, as long as the permit is in place, a report must be submitted.

Please be advised that failure to comply with the effluent limitations and/or monitoring requirements, including adequate laboratory controls, appropriate quality assurance procedures, and records retention, as specified in your Part III-General conditions of your NPDES permit may be cause for enforcement action pursuant to Ohio Revised Code, Chapter 6111. If these violations continue to occur and if satisfactory progress is not made, it may be necessary to initiate enforcement action to achieve compliance.
