**Re: Ohio EPA Storm Water Inspection at IM -246 in St. Louisville, Ohio on April 5, 2012**

Dear Operations Manager:

This letter is written in follow-up to a storm water inspection, I conducted of the Industrial Mining Activities, located in St. Louisville, Ohio on April 5, 2012. This preliminary inspection of IM-246 was conducted to evaluate potential impacts to the North Fork of the Licking River and assess proper permitting for the site.

Based on my evaluation of the site, it appears all drainage from the mining activity in addition to the processing area from the site is contained within the mining pit. I did not note any discharges from the operations to waters of the state.

Please be aware any discharges from the operations must be authorized via an Individual NPDES permit. The General Permit does not appear to apply to these operations as gravel washing is incorporated at this site. Wash water associated with aggregate processing area is considered process waste water and all discharges to waters of the state must be authorized for discharge via an Individual NPDES Permit.
