Dear Mr. Bush and Mr. Mondo:

On July 12, 2012, I visited the site located on the NE quadrant of State Route 60 and East Street located in Lowell, Ohio that has a construction storm water permit with the Ohio EPA. The purpose of my inspection was to determine the compliance of this site with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for discharges of storm water associated with construction activity. The inspection was conducted under the provisions of Ohio's water pollution control statutes, Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Chapter 6111.

As a reminder, violators of ORC 6111 may be fined up to \$10,000 per day of violation. In addition, federal law allows for third party lawsuits for failure to comply with terms and conditions of NPDES permits.

No violations of the terms and conditions of the permit were discovered. Please continue to implement permit requirements as construction continues.

As a reminder, if your project disturbs more than five acres you are required to implement post construction water quality volume storage requirements with permanent storm water management structures as required by the permit.
