Dear Mr. McAtee:

On Friday, August 10, 2012, I inspected the Woodrow Corporation's facility near Springfield to determine compliance with its Industrial Storm Water Discharge Permit. Ron Deere represented the facility during my review.

Based on my observations of the facility's operations, the company appears to be in substantial compliance with the terms of its general Industrial Storm Water Discharge Permit.

Because the company stores its materials and wastes indoors or under roof, it also appears the site could certify that it meets the requirements for a "no exposure" option, which reduces many of the requirements imposed by the Industrial Storm Water Permit. If the company decides to pursue this option, it can self-certify by answering "no" to each of the 11 questions in the "exposure checklist" at the top of page 2 of the no exposure certification form, which is available at the following web link:

The completed checklist is to be signed and sent in to Ohio EPA's Central Office in Columbus. This certification must be renewed every 5 years, assuming the company's activities have not changed such that "significant" materials are managed outdoors and exposed to rainstorms. If the company cannot answer "no" to these questions, the requirements of the industrial permit will remain in effect.
