RE: Storm Water Site Inspection, NPDES Permit # 1GC03606*AG

Dear Mr. Uppenkamp:

On Friday, September 7, 2012, Jordan Senne and I inspected the Indian Trails Resort in Logan County to determine compliance with its construction site storm water discharge permit.

Based on our observations, the site is out of compliance with the following portion of its permit:

Part III.G.2.b Stabilization

Portions of the property where excavation has occurred were observed to be bare. While the plans call for these areas to be developed into lots, exposed soil that is left unworked for extended periods of time is required to be temporarily stabilized. Table 2 on page 16 of the construction permit lists these timeframes.

Temporary stabilization can be accomplished by covering exposed soil with straw, woody debris, wood chips, or by seeding and strawing. Please explain in your written response to this letter what will be done to temporarily stabilize bare soils now present at the site. In addition, please provide the following information:

1. A current version of the site's storm water pollution prevention plan (SWP3);
2. Copies of erosion and sediment control inspection logs kept for the project over the last 2 months (July and August, 2012)
