Dear Mr. Kinney:

On October 19 and 24, 2012 this writer inspected the above referenced construction site for the purpose of determining compliance with General Construction National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit No. 3GC05686*AG. Below is a summary of my observations for these dates:

October 19th

- 1) There has been a minimal amount of precipitation and there has been no need to pump storm water from the sumps to the sedimentation basin.
- 2) The tear in the berm liner observed in the October 15, 2012 inspection has been repaired.
- 3) Haley's Ditch downstream of the sheet piling used to isolate the stream for bridge work was very muddy. Collected water behind the sheet piling was pumped over the sheet piling without using the required filter bag.

October 24th

- 1) There has been a minimal amount of precipitation and there has been no need to pump storm water from the sumps to the sedimentation basin.
- 2) The exposed soil in the swale located near the west storm water retention berm has been re-seeded with seed/matting.
- 3) A filter bag has been installed adjacent to Haley's Ditch to receive pumped water behind the sheet piling. Additional riprap is needed to handle the discharge from the filter bed back into Haley's Ditch downstream of sheet piling.
- 4) Additional seed/matting has been installed along the banks of Haley's Ditch. This area east of Haley's Ditch and the outlet from Summit Lake is constantly being disturbed due to the future bridge construction. As such it probably cannot be totally re-vegetated at this time. This area should have been designed with structural sedimentation controls to control storm water runoff. You are requested to update the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) to include these controls.


