Industrial Storm Water Permit 4GR00515*DG**

Dear Mr. Clonch:

This letter is written in regard to the storm water inspection that I conducted on February 20, 2013, at US Corrugated, Inc., located at 1290 Campground Road, in Lancaster, Ohio. The inspection was conducted to determine compliance with your industrial storm water general permit. Your company manufactures corrugated boxes and started production approximately five years ago. I did not note any discharge from your facility to storm water drains, waters of the state or off of your property. Overall, the facility appeared to be well-kept except for the dumpster areas. The following items were noted during the inspection:

1. Your storm water pollution prevention plan (SWP3) needs to be reviewed annually. A log of the annual review (signature of reviewer and date) must be kept in the SWP3.
2. Please conduct a monthly inspection of your storm water controls and document the inspection in your SWP3.
3. Your facility has two uncovered dumpsters on the south side of your property. All waste containers should be covered. Also, better house-keeping is needed around the dumpsters and loading docks. There was industrial waste located on the ground and pavement around the dumpsters. Please see attached pictures.
4. Trailers were parked in a parking lot on the east-side of the facility. Truck parking was done on the south-side of the facility. No oil was observed staining the parking lot. It was noted that there was a storm water drain down slope of the truck parking area. I recommended that oil spills should be cleaned quickly with absorbent. Spill kits are located near the loading and unloading areas.
5. There was no fueling station at the facility and power washing of the trucks and trailers are not done at your facility.
6. It is recommended that a plug (or plywood and sand bags) be kept available in the event the storm water discharge from your property needs to be plugged due to a spill event.

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All issues noted above should be addressed in your SWP3. If you have any questions regarding this letter or my inspection, please do not hesitate to contact me at our Central District Office at 614-728-3851.
