We have received your self-monitoring report covering the month of February 2013 for the referenced facility. Our review indicates violations of the conditions of your NPDES permit. The specific instances of noncompliance and/or deficiencies are as follows:


We have received your report addressing the reasons for the above violations and the actions being taken to prevent further occurrences. Your explanation is not satisfactory and we request, within ten days of receipt of this letter, written information as to what additional steps you will take to prevent further occurrences.

The Ohio EPA strongly encourages pollution prevention as the preferred approach for waste management. The first priority of pollution prevention is to eliminate the generation of wastes and pollutants at the source (source reduction). For those wastes or pollutants that are generated, the second priority is to recycle or reuse them in an environmentally sound manner.
