Dear Ms. Guynup:

On August 2, 2013, this writer met with you at your company located at 1000 Warner Ave., Canton, Stark County. The purpose of the visit was to determine the status of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan that I had requested from Mario Diano last May 2012. Although the plan was not submitted, it was present at your facility. I reviewed the plan during the visit and determined that it generally met the requirements of the Multi Sector General Permit referenced above. We would like a copy of the plan for our records and for a more detailed review before we do another inspection. Please forward a copy at your convenience.

As I mentioned during our meeting, the plan contains routine inspection, quarterly visual assessment, and comprehensive site inspection checklists, as well as training logs. The information on the checklists and the logs meet the requirements, but they are not being used by your company. This is a violation of the NPDES Permit. Diano Concrete must start using these forms immediately and keep copies with the SWPPP. Also, Benchmark sampling is not being conducted as required. While you still have time to collect four quarterly samples for comparison to the benchmark numbers, time is running out. It is strongly suggested that you contact your consultant for help in meeting the requirements of the NPDES permit to come back into compliance.
