Dear Mr. Suter:

We are in receipt of your self-monitoring reports covering the months of April through June 2013 for the above referenced facility. Our review indicates violations of the conditions of the above referenced National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits. The specific instances of non-compliance are enclosed on separate sheets.

Within 10 days of the date of this letter, please inform this office in writing as to the reasons for the above referenced violations, as well as a description of the actions taken or proposed to prevent any further violations. Your response should include the dates, either actual or proposed, for completion of the actions.

The attached sheet also contains an "AK" code sample result for Station 801. We do not consider this sample result to be a true violation of the Village's NPDES permit since it occurred at the upstream monitoring station and not the wastewater treatment plant's (WWTP's) effluent station.


Please be advised that failure to comply with the effluent limitations and/or monitoring requirements, including adequate laboratory controls, appropriate quality assurance procedures, and records retention, as specified in your Part III-General Conditions of your NPDES permit may be cause for enforcement action pursuant to Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Chapter 6111. If these violations continue to occur and if satisfactory progress is not made, it may be necessary to initiate enforcement action to achieve compliance.
