

## NOTICE OF VIOLATION

The City of Toledo Division of Environmental Services (TDOES) hereby serves notice that:

has violated the following environmental laws, orders, rules, or regulations on the indicated date at the above address.

<p>40 CFR Parts 63.324(d)(1) and (d)(5) ; 40 CFR Part 63.323(a)(1)(i) Permit to Operate (PTO), terms Part II., sections C. 3. and C.4. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements</p> <p>C.3. The permittee shall monitor the refrigeration system high pressure and low pressure during the drying phase or the temperature of the air-perchloroethylene gas-vapor stream on the outlet side of the refrigerated condenser weekly.</p> <p>C.4. The permittee shall monitor the volume of perchloroethylene purchased each month as recorded from perchloroethylene purchase receipts. If no perchloroethylene is purchased during a given month, then the records shall state zero gallons.</p>	<p>On March 31, 2009 during a facility inspection the operator at this facility did not monitor and keep a log of the refrigeration system high pressure and low pressure during the drying phase.</p> <p>On March 31, 2009 during a facility inspection the operator at this facility did not keep a log of the monthly perc usage (including zeroes) and of the 12-month rolling summation of perc.</p>
<p>40 CFR 63.322(o) and PTO, Part II, section C.2. C.2. Once a month, the permittee is to conduct the inspections of the dry cleaning equipment using a halogenated detector or PCE gas analyzer.</p>	<p>On March 31, 2009 during a facility inspection the operator at this facility did not keep a log of the halogen leak detector monthly checks of the dry cleaning equipment.</p>
<p>40 CFR 63.324(f) The permittee was to submit a notification of compliance by registered mail on or before July 28, 2008.</p>	<p>To date, this notification was not received.</p>

The above violation(s) may subject the violator to **penalties** of up to \$25,000 per violation. It is possible that a penalty will be assessed in this case. If a penalty is to be assessed, the amount will be determined after your response is reviewed.

### **Required Actions**

Within fourteen (14) days of receipt of this Notice of Violation, the permittee shall:

1. Abate the violations or provide for an acceptable remedy.
2. Reply in writing to this Notice of Violation within fourteen (14) days of receipt. The reply shall include:
  - a. descriptions and dates of actions taken thus far to abate the violation(s);
  - b. descriptions and expeditious time schedule of actions yet to be taken to remedy the violation(s); and
  - c. descriptions of actions taken or to be taken to prevent recurrence of the violation(s).

### **Recommended Remedial Actions**

It is recommended that you consider the following suggestions:

- Implement all monitoring, recordkeeping, reporting and testing requirements of the Permit to Operate at Stanoszek Investments dba \$1.99 Cleaning.
- Implement the additional requirements of the amended MACT, 40 CFR 63, subpart M, in particular Parts 63.322(o) and 63.324(f).
- Use the halogenated hydrocarbon detector at least once a month and count as one of the weekly visual inspections.
