Dear Ms. Zeigler:

After a discussion with you on May 31, 2012, it came to my attention that this facility no longer operates emission unit D001 (one dry-to dry cleaning machine using perc). This former emission unit was removed and replaced by one petroleum based dry cleaning machine upon your ownership of the facility. After a review of Ohio EPA regulations, the agency does not currently have a permit exemption under OAC 3745-31-03 for petroleum based dry cleaning operations. Because D001 was replaced, ownership for the facility has changed, and petroleum based dry cleaning machines are not exempt from air permitting regulations, the Ohio EPA is requesting that a Permit to Install/Operate (PTIO) application be submitted for the initial installation of this emission unit.

The installation and operation of this emission unit prior to obtaining a PTIO is in violation of OAC rule 3745-31-02 and Ohio Revised Code 3704.05. Therefore, the facility is required to submit a Permit to Install/Operate (PTIO) application for this emission unit. A complete application for the air contaminant source would include a PTIO application (form 3150a), the appropriate Emissions Activity Category (EAC) form for your operations, a process flow diagram, and emissions calculations. These forms can be found on the web at <http://www.epa.ohio.gov/dapc/fops/eacforms.aspx>, and should be submitted by no later than July 6, 2012.

If you need assistance in completing the application forms, please contact either me or the Office of Compliance Assistance and Pollution Prevention (OCAPP). OCAPP offers free, confidential assistance to small businesses.

Because your facility is a Non-Title V facility, you may submit updated applications via mail or electronically on the web based eBusiness Center: Air Services program. Information on this web based program can be found at:

This application will be treated as an initial installation and will be assessed applicable fees. Please be advised that the submission of the requested information to respond to this letter does not constitute waiver of the Ohio EPA's authority to seek civil penalties pursuant to ORC Section 3704.06. The Ohio EPA will make a decision on whether to pursue or decline to pursue such penalties regarding this matter at a later date.

It should be noted that upon the issuance of the new PTIO permit, the former emission unit D001, which is no longer in use at the facility, will be permanently shut down and the permit associated with its operation will be revoked.
