This letter is in response to the Notice of Violation dated September 22, 2008.

-A weekly log of visible emissions checks has been created and a copy is attached to this letter. Visible emission checks are ongoing on a day to day basis to make sure that emissions are minimized or eliminated.

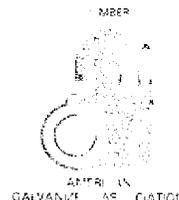
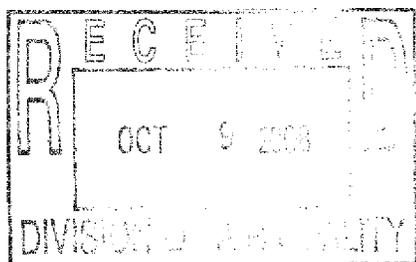
-A daily pressure gauge reading log has been created and a copy is attached.

-The semi-annual reports of deviations to pressure drop readings and visible emissions will be submitted to CDAQ by January 31 and July 31 of every year.

-The Art Galvanizing Works, Inc. has contracted with Air Compliance Testing, Inc. to test the exhaust stack of the baghouse. Jeremiah Hicks is our contact and he can be reached at 216-525-0900 Ext 231. We are enclosing a copy of our contract with him. I explained to him that at the time of inspection we were in the process of ordering new bags and cages for the baghouse. He suggested we wait to do the testing until after the new bags were installed.

Our normal bag supplier, BWF America, has been issued a purchase order for the bags and cages. I am enclosing copies of these quotes with the lead times for delivery. The lead time for the cages is 8-9 weeks; therefore we will be unable to meet the 14 day window for corrections and testing. The following is a timeline that works toward getting the testing done:

Week of Oct 6, 2008: We will shake down the existing bags by hand and check for leaks, etc. This should help with the pressure drop readings and visible emissions. A purchase order has been issued for new bags and cages. Air Compliance Testing to send us drawings for necessary modifications to exhaust stack to facilitate testing.



Week of Oct 27, 2008: Sample cage and bag to be approved. Modifications to fabricated.

Week of Dec 1, 2008: Receipt of new bags and cages. Modifications to exhaust stack installed.

Week of Dec 22, 2008: Installation of new bags and cages complete (weather permitting).

Week of Jan 19, 2009: Testing can be scheduled as new bags have "seasoned" for 30 days.

We are hoping that the timeline above will actually be shorter, and that we can bring our company into compliance in a timely manner. In the meantime, extra attention will be paid to any visible emissions and corrections will be as soon as possible. Please call me at 216-749-0020 with any questions or concerns.
