NOTICE OF VIOLATION: Failure to obtain a Permit to Operate/Install (PTIO) or Permit by Rule (PBR) Notification Form; Failure to conduct required Stage II testing; Failure to maintain required records; Failure to complete Stage II Vapor Recovery training

Owner/Responsible Official:

On 1/20/12, the Cleveland Division of Air Quality (CDAQ) inspected Sunoco located at 28021 Miles Rd. in Orange Village. This letter serves as notification that you are operating sources in violation of the following applicable air statutes, air regulations, or air permit conditions.

CDAQ records indicate this facility having been shut down 7/20/09 thru 6/16/11. According to the attendant on duty at the time of the site visit, this station was re-opened within the last several months under new ownership.

Sunoco failed to obtain a PTIO or PBR for this facility. This is a violation of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) rule 3704.03 and the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule 3745-31-02.

Sunoco failed to conduct required Stage II Vapor Recovery System testing. This is a violation of OAC rule 3745-21-09(DDD)(1)and(2).

Sunoco failed to maintain required gasoline delivery, testing, maintenance and inspection records. This is a violation of OAC rule 3745-21-09(DDD)(3)(a) and (b).

Sunoco failed to have an operator or local manager attend and complete required Stage II Vapor Recovery Training. This is a violation of OAC rule 3745-21-09(DDD)(3)(a)(vi).



Unless you undertake some type of corrective action with respect to the above noted violations, you will remain in non-compliance. CDAQ requests that Sunoco submit a PTIO or a PBR Notification Form; conduct required Stage II Vapor Recovery testing; provide copies of required record keeping and certification of Stage II Vapor Recovery training to the following enforcement representative:

Your written response to this letter must be received by CDAQ within fourteen (14) days of your receipt of this letter. If there is insufficient time to correct the alleged violations within this timeframe, your response must include a timeline for correcting the alleged violations.

The appropriate PBR Notification Form and supplemental form(s) were provided to the attendant on duty at the time of the site visit. Please note that all permit applications submitted to CDAQ must include original signatures. Photocopied signatures are not valid; the application will not be accepted by CDAQ and will be returned to you if original signatures are not provided.

Permit-to-install/operate (PTIO) applications may be completed through the Ohio EPA eBusiness Center at <https://ebiz.epa.ohio.gov/>. An account is required to be created and a pin number assigned.

Violations of Ohio air pollution laws and /or permit terms and conditions are subject to the penalties stipulated in Ohio Revised Code Section 3704.99(A), which allows fines of not more than twenty-five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both, for each violation.

Free assistance with state and/or federal regulations, rules, laws or permit conditions can be provided at no charge through the Ohio EPA Office of Compliance Assistance and Pollution Prevention (OCAPP). OCAPP can be contacted at <http://www.epa.ohio.gov/ocapp> or (614) 644-3469 or (800) 329-7518. CDAQ makes no guarantee that the facility will meet the qualifying guidelines established by OCAPP.

CDAQ issues this letter with Ohio EPA's concurrence. The failure to mention any specific violation does not excuse any violations of local, state and federal laws or regulations regarding air pollution control. Violations of air pollution control laws may be pursued in local court or referred to Ohio EPA or U.S. EPA for further enforcement action.
