Dear Mr. Miller:

Our records indicate that Ohio Trailer Company Inc. located at 1901 Tod Ave SW in Warren, Ohio has failed to submit a Renewal Permit-to-Install and Operate (PTIO) application for the following emission units:

P001 - concrete plant;
R001- Truck and trailer repaint booth #1;
R002- Truck and trailer repaint booth #2; and
R003- Truck and trailer repaint booth #3.

Ohio Administrative Code Rule 3745-31-02 requires that the owner or operator of an air contaminant source apply for and obtain a PTIO for each emissions unit. Renewal applications are due within six months prior to the expiration date. The permit for the above referenced units expired on July 18, 2012.

Please submit your PTIO application to my attention at the Northeast District Office for the emission units listed above **within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter**. Blank PTIO application forms are enclosed for your convenience. You may download additional forms if needed from our website at <http://www.epa.ohio.gov/dapc/fops/eac/eacforms.aspx>. Please feel free to make copies as needed. Failure to respond to this request in the stated time frame can result in a referral to the Central Office of Ohio EPA for the appropriate enforcement action.

If your records indicate that you submitted the applications on time, please resubmit these along with your documentation of the submittal being done in a timely basis.

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If these emissions units have been permanently shut down, please reply with the date of the shutdown. If the emissions units have been temporarily shut down, you will need to obtain a PTIO prior to its return to service. If the entire facility has been sold or shut down, please reply with the new owner's information or the date of closure.

The submission of the requested permit application does not constitute a waiver of Ohio EPA's authority to seek civil penalties as provided in ORC 3704.06. Ohio EPA will decide whether to pursue or decline to pursue penalties regarding this matter at a later date.
