Dear Mr. Rankin:

This is in follow-up to my facility inspection at your 1 General Street facility in Akron, Ohio on Wednesday, April 29, 2009 and is intended to summarize my findings regarding the general compliance status of your facility with applicable air pollution control requirements. I would like to thank you and Trevor Doll for your cooperation during my visit.

Please be advised that no major problems were found, however, there are some deficiencies that require your immediate attention and corrective action. Keep in mind that these items could be construed as being violations of applicable requirements and should be addressed as such. The deficient items, related emissions unit(s), and brief description are identified below (see checked items) :

Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements term C.5.d; OEPA Emissions Unit(s) ID: F001
Description: on a calendar quarter basis, the total number of days the control measure(s) was (were) implemented.

Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements term C.4.d; OEPA Emissions Unit(s) ID: F002
Description: on a calendar quarter basis, the total number of days the control measures were implemented and the total number of days where snow and/or ice cover or precipitation were sufficient to not require the control measures.

Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements term C.9.d; OEPA Emissions Unit(s) ID: F003
Description: on a calendar quarter basis, the total number of days the control measures were implemented and, for wind erosion from pile surfaces, the total number of days where snow and/or ice cover or precipitation were sufficient to not require the control measures(s).

Reporting Requirements term D.3; OEPA Emissions Unit(s) ID: B001; Description: the permittee shall also submit annual reports that specify the total operating hours from this emissions unit for the previous calendar year (January through December). These reports shall be submitted by January 31 of each year.

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This letter is a reminder of your regulatory responsibility regarding the operation of air pollution emissions units at your facility. A thorough review of related Ohio EPA Permits is recommended.

On the day that I visited your 1 General Street site, I was told that the quarterly totals of days in which control measures were implemented for emissions units F001, F002, and F003 were kept at your Louisville office. Since I was not able to verify that those records were actually being kept, it would be appropriate that copies of each of those records, dating back to the issuance of Permit to Install (PTI) 16-02475 (March 18, 2008) be forwarded to this office, along with the missing report on the 2008 operating hours of emissions unit B001 which was due on January 31, 2009. Please submit the documents referenced above to bring the emissions units mentioned above into compliance no later than fourteen (14) days from the receipt of this letter. If you need additional time, please notify this agency in writing.

The submission of the requested documents does not constitute a waiver of either Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) or US EPA's authority to seek penalties in this matter. The decision to pursue, or decline to pursue, additional enforcement action in this case will be made at a later date.

Keep in mind that this determination is based upon a site visit and preliminary review of available records. It does not ensure that you have been or will continue to operate in compliance and in no way limits any liability if violations are discovered for this time period.
